
Total Casualties Since Mid-March 2011

Since mid-March 2011 up until **December** 2024, the Violations Documentation Center documented a total of **243,097** battle-related deaths.

• **147,370 (60.62%)** Among them were Civilians

• 95,727 (39.38%) Were Non-Civilians









Deaths by the Parties Responsible

The parties responsible for civilian casualties from mid-March 2011 up until December 2024:








Battle-Related Deaths


During the month of **December 2024**, a total number of 381 deaths were documented across different Syrian governorates; all of them were documented by their full names.

The number of civilian deaths reached **264** while the number of non-civilian deaths was **117**






Causes of Death

87 deaths were caused by firearms and snipers, 92 deaths by aerial attacks and barrel bombs, and 60 battle-related deaths were caused by tanks, cannons and mortars.
1 deaths was caused by torture in Syrian government detention centers, 45 deaths were caused by land mines and car explosives and 0 death resulted from torture by kidnappers.
0 deaths were caused by lack of medical aid and relief in besieged areas and 0 case was caused by chlorine gas.


96 case of death was caused by other reasons.



Deaths by Gender

The total number of adult (over 18 years of age) male deaths is **304** while the total number of adult female deaths is **33**.

The total for child battle-related deaths is **44**, with **34** for male children and **10** for female children.







All figures and statistics presented in this report were retrieved from the database of the Violations Documentation Center (VDC). They are not final and are subject to continuous and periodic scrutiny by the VDC's database administrators and the field documentation team. Figures differ between reports and the most recent report is considered to be the most accurate.
